- 1. Critically outline the major historical and cultural developments in American Literature from the country's independence to the present. - 7. Examine the themes of gender equity, violence against women and trauma in Toni Morrison's *Beloved* (15 marks).
- 8. With reference to Olaudah Equiano's <u>The Interesting Narrative of Olaudah Equiano</u>, <u>Or Gustavus Vassa, the Native</u> describe any FOUR themes in the slave narrative (15 marks).
