Question One (Compulsory, 30 marks)

Question Two (20 marks)

- (a) Identity and briefly explain at least **five** key philosophical arguments of Negritude scholars. (10 marks)
- (b) Use the poems of either Aime Cesaire or Leopold Sedar Seghor to illustrate how the Negritude ideas discussed above are evident in the form and content of the poems. (10 marks)

- (a) Using Edward Said's critique of Imperialism in his book *Orientalism* (1978), discus a text by either Shakespeare, Defoe, or Conrad to reflect on:
 - (i) The main themes and how they reflect different aspects of imperialism (10 marks)
 - (ii) Character relations and conflicts in terms of power relations between the colonizer and the colonized in one European canonical text studied in the course (10 marks)

(b) Identify and discuss **six issues** in *Robinson Crusoe* by Daniel Defoe that J. M. Coetzee takes up and re-represents, refutes or deconstructs in his novel Foe. (20 marks)
