- 1. Raja Rao in the Foreword to *Kanthapura* states: "It may have been told of an evening, when as the dusk falls, and through the sudden quiet, lights leap up in house after house, and stretching her bedding on the veranda, a grandmother might have told you, newcomer, the sad tale of her village."
 - a) Does this make the story an oral tale? With close reference to the novel, qualify your answer with any five illustrations. (15 marks).
 - b) The same Foreword speaks the condition of postcolonial writer. Justify with any three detailed illustrations. (15 marks)
- 2. Explain any four (4) characteristics that make an Indian sub-continent novel 'Gandhian'. Use any suitable novel studied in the course for illustration. (20 marks).
- 3. "The Indian sub-continent novel is a product of its time and place," discuss the validity of this statement with close reference to any novel studied in this course except *Kanthapura*. (20 marks)
- 4. V.S. Naipaul's *An Area of Darkness* exposes the writer's diasporic anxieties from his homeland. Discuss with close reference to the novel. (20 marks).
- 5. With suitable examples, demonstrate that Arundhati Roy's *The God of Small Things* is a private-familial tragic story that weaves together the personal and the historical. (20 marks).
